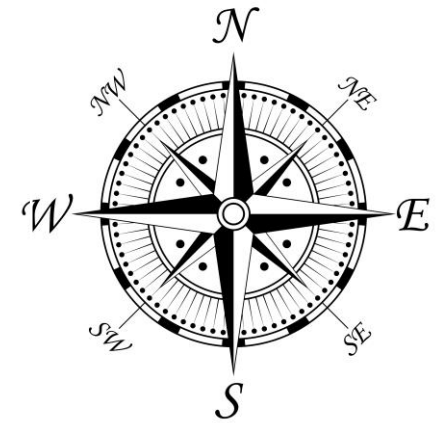

Project RETURN is a part of the statewide ROC Wisconsin Campaign (formerly the 11X15 Campaign) started by the statewide grassroots organization WISDOM. The goal of this campaign remains the same – to reduce the prison population, as well as reforming prison policy and the care of those who are incarcerated. The main focus of the campaign is to promote a rehabilitative approach to corrections instead of the punitive approach.
